WESTWOOD PARK - Roof and HVAC Replacement

CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION NARRATIVE

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Previously, the Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners (Board) approved the scope of work for the Westwood Park – Roof and HVAC Replacement (PRJ21845) Project, which included replacing the recreation center's HVAC and roof, while doing a methane study to determine whether a methane detection system is necessary (Report Nos. 25-064).

RAP Staff has determined that the Project's scope needs to be further modified to include installing the new fire alarm system at the recreation center.

The project is located at 1350 South Sepulveda Boulevard, Los Angeles, CA, 90025, in the Westwood Community Planning Area (Fig.1).

II. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Basis for Categorical Exemption

The proposed Project consists of addition of safety devices for use in conjunction with existing structures and replacement of existing structures where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and have substantially the same purpose and capacity.

Based on this description, the proposed Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article 19, Sections 15301(f) and 15302 of California CEQA Guidelines as well as to Article III, Section 1, Class 1(6), Class 2 and Class 2(6) of City CEQA Guidelines.

Consideration of Potential Exceptions to Use of a Categorical Exemption

The State CEQA Guidelines (CCR Sec 15300.2) limit the use of categorical exemptions in the following circumstances:

1. Location. Exemption Classes 3, 4, 5, 6, and 11 are qualified by consideration of where the project is to be located – a project that is ordinarily insignificant in its impact on the environment may be significant in a particularly sensitive environment. Therefore, these classes are considered to apply to all instances, except where the project may impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped, and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies.

The proposed project falls under Class 1, and 2, therefore, this exception has no application here.

2. Cumulative Impact. This exception applies when, although a particular project may not have a significant impact, the cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time is significant.

The proposed project consists of repairs and improvements to an existing Recreation Center. No other known projects would involve cumulatively significant impacts, and no future projects would result from the proposed project. Therefore, this exception has no application here.

3. Significant Effect. This exception applies when, although the project may otherwise be exempt, there is a reasonable possibility that the project will have a significant effect due to unusual circumstances.

RAP is not aware of any unusual circumstances associated with this project. Therefore, this exception has no application here.

4. Scenic Highway. A categorical exemption shall not be used for a project that may result in damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway.

The proposed project is not within sight of any state designated scenic highway, nor of any other historic and scenic resource. Therefore, this exception has no application here.

5. Hazardous Waste Site. This exception applies when a project is located on a site listed as a hazardous waste site under Government Code Section 65962.5.

As of December 1, 2025, the State Department of Toxic Substances Control (Envirostor at www.envirostor.dtsc.ca.gov) and the State Water Resources Control Board (Geotracker at <https://Geotracker.waterboards.ca.gov>) have not listed any site within the project area or in a 1,000 feet radius from the area. Therefore, this exception has no application here.

6. Historical Resources. This exception applies when a project may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.

The proposed project area is not located in proximity of known historical, paleontological or archeological resources. No excavation required for the proposed project, and this office does not anticipate the disruption of archaeological or paleontological resources.

Therefore, this exception has no application here.
