2. Authorize Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP) staff to commit from the following fund and work order numbers a maximum of \$120,000.00 in Park Fees for the proposed Project;

- 5. Determine that the proposed Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article 19, Section 15301(d) [Restoration or rehabilitation of deteriorated or damaged structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment to meet current standards of public health and safety] and Section 15302 [Replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and have substantially the same purpose and capacity] of California CEQA Guidelines and Article III, Section 1, Class 1(4) and Class 2 of City CEQA Guidelines, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the Los Angeles County Clerk and the Governor's Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation;
- 6. Authorize RAP's Chief Accounting Employee to prepare a check to the Los Angeles County Clerk in the amount of \$75.00 for the purpose of filing an NOE; and,
- 7. Authorize RAP staff to make technical corrections as necessary to carry out the intent of this Report.

SUMMARY

Pan Pacific Park is located at 7600 Beverly Boulevard in the Fairfax District community of the City. This 32.18-acre facility provides multipurpose fields, play areas, a swimming pool, a recreation center, basketball courts, and a senior center for the surrounding communities. Due to the size of the park, and the facilities, features, and programs it provides, Pan Pacific Park meets the standard for a Community Park, as defined in the City's Public Recreation Plan.

PROJECT SCOPE

The Project's scope of work involves replacing the chain link fence around the synthetic soccer field.

PROJECT FUNDING

Upon approval of this Report, \$120,000.00 in Park Fees can be committed to the proposed Project, which is the total budget including the budget contingency amount set forth below. See below the anticipated pre-qualified on-call contract(s) and budget contingency amount(s) that will be used for the Project:

The Park Fees were collected within five miles of Pan Pacific Park, which is the standard distance for the commitment of Park Fees for community recreational facilities pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 12.33 E.3.

TREES AND SHADE

This Project will have no impact on the existing trees and shade at Pan Pacific Park.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

The proposed Project consists of (i) the rehabilitation of damaged structures to meet current standards of public health and safety, and (ii) the replacement of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity.

According to the parcel profile report retrieved on May 1, 2025, this area resides in a methane zone, but the replacement of an existing chain-link fence is not going to expose park patrons or workers to methane seepage. This site is not within a coastal, liquefaction, or historic zone, so there is no reasonable possibility that the proposed Project may impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern or have a significant effect due to unusual circumstances. No other known projects would involve cumulatively significant impacts, and no future projects would result from the proposed Project. As of May 1, 2005, the State Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) (Envirostor at www.envirostor.dtsc.ca.gov) and the State Water Resources Control Board (Geotracker (SWRCB) https://geotracker.waterboards.ca.gov/) have not listed the Project site. They listed Case SL2049G1726 within 1,000 feet from the proposed Project site. The case is the nearby shopping center, where a methane monitoring system has been installed. According to the Caltrans Scenic Highway Map, there is no scenic highway located within - or adjacent to - the Project site. Furthermore, the proposed Project is not located in proximity of a known historical resources and will not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of any historical resource.

Based on this information, staff recommends that the Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners (Board) determines that the proposed Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article 19, Section 15301(d) and 15302 of California CEQA Guidelines as well as Article III, Section 1, Class 1(4) and Class 2 of City CEQA Guidelines. Staff will file a Notice of Exemption with the Los Angeles County Clerk and the Governor's Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation upon Board's approval.

FISCAL IMPACT

The approval of this commitment of Park Fees will have no fiscal impact on RAP's General Fund. The estimated costs for the design, development, and construction of the proposed park improvements are anticipated to be funded by Park Fees or funding sources other than RAP's General Fund. The maintenance of the proposed park improvements can be performed by current staff with minimal impact to existing maintenance service at this facility.
