RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Accept the work performed for the Rio de Los Angeles State Park – Synthetic Field Replacement (PRJ21749) Project (Project), constructed by Department of Recreation and Parks' (RAP) prequalified on-call contractor(s);
2. Approve the decommitment of \$207,130.00 in Park Fees from the Project; and,
3. Authorize RAP staff to make technical corrections to this Report as necessary to carry out the intent of this Report.

SUMMARY

Rio De Los Angeles State Park is located at 1900 North San Fernando Road in the Northeast community of the City. This 39.39-acre facility provides a children's play area, community room, multipurpose room, picnic tables, tennis courts, baseball diamond (lighted), soccer field, synthetic field, walking paths, and basketball courts. Due to the size of the park, and the facilities and features and programs it provides, Rio De Los Angeles State Park meets the standard for a Community Park, as defined in the City's Public Recreation Plan.

Previously, the Board of Recreation and Park Commissioner (Board) approved the commitment of \$1,420,000.00 in Park Fees for the Synthetic Field Replacement Project at Rio de Los Angeles State Park, which included the demolition of the existing field and replacing it with a new synthetic field to match the existing soccer layout (BR 24-030).

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Project was completed in February 2024 by RAP's on-call vendors and RAP Construction forces, with a total expenditure of \$1,212,870.00.

Upon approval of this Report, \$207,130.00 in Park Fees can be de-committed from the Project in order to be made available for future projects.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

According to the project description, the proposed Board's action consists of the decommitment of funding from a project that has been completed. The Board approved the Project on February 1, 2024 (BR 24-030) and determined that it was exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Since the residual funding has not been assigned to any new project and there is no possibility that the proposed action might have any direct or indirect impact on the environment, staff recommends that the Board take no further CEQA action.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to RAP's General Fund. The maintenance of the park improvements is being performed by current staff with no overall impact to existing maintenance services.
