

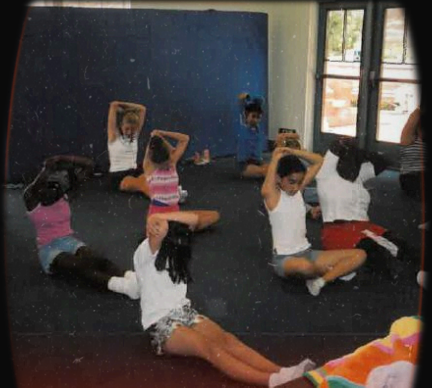

Registration

Our Camp

Camp Hollywoodland's mission is to provide our campers a place where girls can come to have fun, meet new friends, face new challenges, learn, improve new skills, experience group living, learn to express their creativity, and build a positive self-image. Methods we use to achieve this mission include creating community, building relationships, leading by example, helping build self-reliance, providing opportunities to learn and master new skills, and teaching coping skills to move through new or uncomfortable experiences.

We believe that our camp is place where girls can find their own sense of self, experience independence, practice facing fears, be inspired by and participate in a diverse community of young women, overcome challenges, and seize opportunities to develop both hard and soft skills. If you're unsure if our camp is for you, please call the office to discuss prior to registering.

Readiness for Our Camp

In order to participate in our program, a camper needs to be able to move independently from place to place, meet their own personal care needs (i.e. tie shoes, brush hair and teeth, shower, use the toilet, feed themselves, etc.), carry their own luggage, and live cooperatively in a group environment (that may or may not include a cabin buddy).

When campers are ready for overnight camp, it can be a transformative, learning and growing experience. We have found that campers acclimate best when they are able to vocalize their needs and self-advocate (e.g. I don't understand what to do, I need water, I need help, I feel...). To best set your camper up for success, please consider reviewing these concepts with her prior to attending camp. We can most effectively work to find solutions in real time when campers are able to share the discomforts or struggles that they're experiencing as they occur.

Registration

Parents/guardians will be required to register on our website and complete all listed forms. All youth must be registered in advance to participate in our program. Onsite registration will not be accepted unless called off of the waiting list for attendance that day. It is understood and agreed that no refund or reduction in fees are made for late arrivals, early departures, withdrawals or requests to leave due to misconduct.

The rules of acceptance and participation in camp programs are the same for everyone, without regard to race, color, religion or national origin. Please allow a minimum of 2 weeks prior notification for interpretive services. If you are a person with a disability and require accommodation to participate in a City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks program, service, or activity, requests may be made by calling the facility (323-467-7193), or 711 for CA Relay, ten days in advance of the event. We will do our best to fulfill requests with less than ten business days' notice.

Enrollment Information

How to Register

Registration will become available on our website in March. Camper registration (campers ages 6-14) will begin at 11am and become available over the course of four days, as follows:

Tuesday March 17, 2026 - Register for Session 1 & 2

Wednesday March 18, 2026 - Register for Session 3 & 4

Thursday March 19, 2026 - Register for Session 5 & 6

Friday March 20, 2026 - Register for Session 7 & 8

Our website is: recreation.parks.lacity.gov/camp/camp-hollywoodland/ Please be aware that thousands of patrons partake in this process when registration opens. Reviewing your account prior to registration (confirming correct information on your child), familiarizing yourself with the website, and checking the e-mail you'll receive post-registration (which confirms whether your spot is **either** on the waitlist (\$0 sale) or in the session (session price paid). Please take note of both the fees for altering sessions (canceling, switching, etc) as well as the guidelines for requesting buddies before registering your camper.

Waiting List

The waiting list will become available on our website for you to join once a session is filled. You must add your own camper to the waitlist through our website as there are waivers to sign. Parents will be notified when space is available in their child's age group. Please confirm the phone number and e-mail connected to your profile are your primary forms of communication. We are not responsible for missed contact. Payment is not required at the time of application submission for the waiting list. Cabin buddies are never guaranteed. When your child is called off of the waiting list, we have space in a specific cabin that may not be with your child's cabin buddy.

ePact Invitations after Registration

We are now using ePACT, a secure online emergency network, to handle much of our camp paperwork. You will receive a link to register once you have been accepted into your first residential session. It must be updated with changes, but can carry your information over to multiple sessions to save you time. Your submission online does not provide camp with an adequate record. You will need to download, print, and bring your ePact record with you to check-in, or fill out new paperwork when you get on site. Returning campers can access their ePact account at <https://portal-us.epactnetwork.com/login> . Please note that day camp epact records and residential camp records are not the same.

Dropping Things Off / Showing Up At Camp

No one is allowed to visit or drop anything off at camp during a session (including parents, relatives, friends) without arranging with the proper staff. It presents security risks and can lead to homesickness among campers. If you do decide to come without prior arrangement, you will be asked to take your child home with you at that time.

Confirmation Packets, Late Fees, Changing Sessions & Cancellations

Confirmation Packet

A confirmation packet will be available to download one month before summer camp begins. At check-in, you will be required to turn in a Confirmation Packet form (available for download on our website), confirming in writing that you have read and understand all information presented in the packet.

Attention to New Policy Updates

The City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks has updated the rates and fees for the Camping Division. Please read this section carefully to note the changes. The fees listed in this brochure reflect the updated changes.

Late Fees

If room is available after the deadline (2 weeks prior to the start of the session), we will accept registration with a **\$50 late fee**.

Cancellations

All cancellations must be made in writing (e-mail is accepted).

Refunds take approximately 6-8 weeks. The cancellation policy is as follows:

Requests 14+ days prior to the start of the program	85% Refund of Fees
Requests 7-13 days prior to the start of the program	50% Refund of Fees
Requests 6 days or less prior to the start of the program	No Refund of Fees

The first day of the camp session (at 8:00am) constitutes the start of the program.

Switching Sessions

Request for changes of session will be accommodated if space is available.

The switching session fee is the cancellation fee plus the price difference between sessions.

Fees will be charged per camper based on the earliest effected session as follows:

1. With 2 weeks or more notice, you will be charged 15% of your original session fee, plus the difference in session prices where applicable.
2. Less than 2 weeks notice, you will be charged 50% of your original session fee, plus the difference in session prices where applicable.

No change of session will be allowed for "No-shows." No session change will be made until a written request and appropriate fees are received.

The Heart of Hollywoodland

Our Camper Program (6-14 years old)

Camp Hollywoodland is the best kept secret in Los Angeles. Offering swimming, crafts, cooperative living skills, nature awareness, field trips, and themed programs that include: meals, lodging, snacks, equipment and supervision.

Girls 6 -14 years old are divided into cabin groups with a 2 year age span (ages 6-8, 9-11, 12-14). Each cabin has 2-3 counselors that sleep in the cabins with their campers. The counselor-camper ratio is set by the American Camp Association.

The program schedule is from 7:30 am (rise & shine) until 8:30 or 9:30PM. During the course of the day, campers will attend a variety of activities. All activities are taught by trained and experienced staff. Check-in each week is Monday 8:00 - 9:30AM and check-out is 5:00 - 6:30PM on the last day of session.

Our Teenage Leadership Development Program (15-17 years old)

Girls 15-17 years old are eligible to register for Camp Hollywoodland's CLD Program. This exciting program offers guidance in working with younger campers; assisting with camp activities; a place for teenage girls to work together and build friendships; a place to build a strong sense of self; an opportunity to enhance leadership skills, disconnect from technology; and to better prepare for future counselor opportunities. See the CLD brochure on our website for information. This program does not qualify for school service hours.

Our Staff

At Camp Hollywoodland, we believe that the camp experience shapes children's lives. Our program aligns with the American Camp Association's "7 Camp Outcome Domains", which are Friendship Skills, Responsibility, Independence, Family/Citizenship, Teamwork, Competence and Exploration. Keeping this in mind, all of our staff are at least college-age and chosen for their communication skills, experience or training in child development, the ability to be excellent role models and desire to create these outcomes.

Our rigorous selection process follows the ACA guidelines and includes multiple interviews, references and a background check. Our staff members undergo a minimum of one week intensive training and are certified in CPR and Standard First Aid prior to the start of camp. During the camping season, our staff is continually evaluated and guided to enhance their skills. The relationship between a camper and their counselor is at the heart of our camp's success.

Buddy Requests

Our Philosophy

Cabin Buddy requests have been an ongoing consideration for us. While we embrace the idea of campers requesting one cabin buddy to enhance their experience, we've noticed instances where some campers have sought multiple buddies, leading to complications when their requests couldn't be accommodated. This has occasionally caused challenges within cabin groups, where campers arriving alone may feel a bit disconnected.

We've observed that when campers arrive without pre-established buddy groups, it fosters a more inclusive environment. We recognize that camp can be a unique opportunity for campers to reunite with cherished friends or family members, so we will continue to honor single cabin buddy requests; requests of more than one cabin buddy per week will not be honored. Our aim is to ensure that everyone feels welcome and part of the camp community.

Guidelines for Requesting a Buddy

1. Each camper may request exactly one cabin buddy.
2. A camper may only request a cabin buddy in her own age group (6-8, 9-11, 12-14).
3. In order for your request to be considered, the cabin buddy you requested on your child's registration form, must also request your child as their buddy on their registration form. It must be mutual to be considered as a cabin buddy request. If changes need to be made, e-mail camp.hollywoodland@lacity.org at least 10 days before the start of program.
4. To be considered, cabin buddy requests can only be mutual requests between two buddies. If more than one name is entered on the cabin buddy section of the registration form or buddy request e-mail, all requests will be null and void and no cabin buddy will be granted.
5. Cabin buddy requests are requests only; cabin buddies can NEVER be guaranteed. At Camp Hollywoodland we believe that camp is an opportunity for campers to make new friends and try new things. Sending your child to camp without a cabin buddy allows them the freedom to do both of these things without judgment from someone who knows them in the outside world.

How to go about Requesting a Buddy

There are two ways to request a cabin buddy for your child:

- 1.) Include the buddy's name and age when prompted while registering on our website
- 2.) Send an e-mail to camp.hollywoodland@lacity.org with the subject line "Cabin Buddy Request - Session name or Number" In the body of the e-mail, include both your daughter and her buddy's FIRST NAME, LAST NAME, AND AGES. Both camper's guardians must confirm the pairing (via Rectrac during registration or e-mail).

We're hiring now for Summer 2026!

Residential Camp Counselor Qualifications: Female, at least 18 years of age with a High School Diploma or equivalent (preferably one year of college completed), desire and ability to work with children, to teach activities and work outdoors.

Activity Leader Qualifications: Any gender, at least 18 years of age with a High School Diploma or equivalent (preferably one year of college completed), desire and ability to work with children, to teach activities and work outdoors, ability to lift 50 lbs., ability to work at heights of 40 ft. for extended periods of time.

Cook Qualifications: Any gender, at least 18 years of age with a High School Diploma or equivalent Has working knowledge of kitchen methods and procedures for preparing, cooking, baking, and serving foods in large quantities. Two or more years' experience as a cook in a large camp, restaurant, hotel, armed forces or similar preferred.

Kitchen Assistant (SPA II) Qualification: Any gender, at least 18 years of age; must be responsible, dependable, able to understand and follow directions, and to work under minimal supervision. Some knowledge and experience working in a commercial kitchen is desirable.
